 Fighting for the Vote: Pat Supplee, Evelyn, and Peggy are working on virtual lesson plan based on a Powerpoint developed by the Austin TX LWV that walks students through the process to register to vote and vote by mail. They are working to have teachers in the schools previously scheduled for Fighting for the Vote deliver the lesson virtually. LWVUS grant for FFtV has extended the deadline from the end of June to past the general election due to COVID-19. Ted Dellinger has requested candidate information from the municipal clerks of Loch Arbour and Allenhurst and has invited candidates from those communities to participate in VOTE411 The other two town clerks have not responded. NJ Reentry:	Annette
 Annette is participating by offering virtual voter fregistration support to returning citizens. She responded to a state prison inmate (Ralph Hendrickson) who wrote offering to volunteer after seeing Annette on NJTV. Thanked him for his interest and explained the constraints on his participation. 	
 She is participating in a conference call with the group Indivisible on April 14th @7pm, for voter education and registration and in particular registering citizens on parole or probation. Annette did her first teleconference for the Bergen County Reentry program. She updated 	
the staff as to the new voting changes and was also able to speak to 2 citizens who were released Monday, one was on parole and one was not. She is leaving registration forms outside doors including postage. There may be Federal funds available to states to assist in vote-by-mail programs to pay postage.	
 Sol Hara pointed out that Gov. Murphy on his press conference emphasized that job openings are posted on the NJ website (Instacart). Applicants may apply on-line, but many have no computers and libraries are closed. Annette pointed out the barriers during self- quarantine, on interviewing for positions.

New Jersey Primary. Has been rescheduled from June 2 to July 7 th . A change in party affiliation must be declared 55 days ahead. By law, undeclared voters can declare a party at the polls the day of the election. Peggy wrote to Jesse Burns to ask how this will work if the state decides to run the Primary exclusively by mail. Jesse Burns replied: "Unaffiliated apply for vote by mail ballot County clark sends both Bon, and Dom, ballet."	Evelyn
