Energizing Young Voters (EYV)

Director - Pat Supplee

Energizing Young Voters Business Plan - delivered to Jesse Burns and LWVNJ Board President to help guide EYV/LWVNJ collaboration into the future

Looking to develop the business side of EYV:

- Establish a traditional board of directors to assure program continuance
- Enrolled in Brookdale certificate program for nonprofit management and development
- Joined two business groups (Monmouth and Ocean Development Council and NJ Industry and Business Association) to network with other nonprofit groups

Internship - Sheil Shah, a student at Middlesex Co. College is our spring '22 intern, has hit the ground running with research and GOTV efforts

Website - League volunteer web designer will embed code that will allow us to track usage and set up a search function, and potentially set up a payment function for *I AM the Change* digital version that will resolve LWVNJ concerns about financial implications for them

Curriculum development - Speak to be Heard is nearing completion and will be piloted in April and May.

Collaborations -

- YWCA of North Jersey series of three evenings with most of our programs (Feb./March) with lessons being offered by our student presenters
- Camden Community Coalition in conjunction with NJEA planning for community and school presentations and student involvement
- Smithsonian Voice and Votes: Democracy in America (From revolution and suffrage to civil rights and casting ballots, the exhibit will explore a variety of concepts related to democracy in America)
 - Program planning is underway at Rowan College at Burlington and Brookdale
 Community College will be providing weekly lessons for the public and lessons for classes who sign up ahead of time during their museum visit; Excuses! Excuses!
 Excuses! will be offered as a game during visiting hours opening 4/5/22
 - Part of committee to plan community outreach activities at Brookdale Community College (Aug- Oct exhibit)
 - Outreach to 4 other community college sites who will host the exhibit from May through December 2022: Atlantic/Cape May County, Middlesex, Mercer, and Union Co Colleges (if you have any connections, please let Pat know.)

Young Voters Advisory Board think tank meeting 2/6/22 set the following direction for the next 3 months:

- Application and attendance policy: Approved; discussion about how to maintain diversity as board members turn over after their 2-year terms.
- Website Discussion on design needed: more photos/videos (short), gathering opinions, offering quizzes/games and questionnaires, videos, to attract repeat visits; EYV board members will help design
- Curriculum development
 - Board members will supply ideas for scenarios that appeal to young people to use for practice in the Speak to be Heard lesson.
 - Consensus is that we should add a lesson on communication on social media
- Upcoming presentations by students
 - Diversity Club Middletown S and Rowan literature class (Fighting for Change: I AM the Change)
 - Three student teams will present evening YWCA series (Timeline of Suffrage and Who's Got the Power 2/23; Vote by Design and Casting Your Ballot 3/3 and What's Your Issue and I AM the Change on 3/10.
 - Experienced students will partner with new to help expand presentations to new groups in each of the schools represented on the Board.
- GOTV Efforts with young voters it is felt that we need to beef up our voter registration and GOTV efforts in the schools in which we present our lessons to better assure that the intention to vote leads to voting behavior
 - Joining <u>Students Learn/Students Vote</u> Coalition (SLSV) a national organization supporting organizations like ours with connections, resources, grants, etc.
 - NJ Ballot Bowl website plan for Get Out the Vote (GOTV) efforts. Students sign a commitment to vote which is part of the All In Campus Voting Challenge at voter registration drives (a second table); Stickers specific to EYV -- our logo and "I'm going to be a voter" when they sign a commitment to vote; then, a go to the polls together event/ and transportation if we can figure out a way to provide it then to a photo of those who went with your I Voted sticker idea.
 - Social media: need to augment our presence
 - Every board member will take responsibility for posting on the Facebook and Instagram accounts; emphasis on real people doing real things (photos/videos,) not just inspirational posts.
 - Board members will communicate with one another between meetings, with one member serving as the organizer to set up a texting system
 - Everything posted must adhere to the League Nonpartisan and DEI policies
 - Different media should target different audiences with different content. We will consider the idea of TikTok videos to appeal to younger audiences
 - We will begin to use hashtags, but will watch for whether the algorithms begin to align us with one or another political party in which case we need to rethink. #GetOutTheVote was suggested
 - Consider boosting our most frequently hit posts on Facebook
